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1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back)
Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with the Head of School, via admin@goodmayes.redbridge.sch.uk, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible. We do not require children to wear a school logo on their jumper or cardigan; however these can be purchased if parents so wish.
- Limiting items with distinctive characteristics to low-cost or long-lasting items, such as ties

- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveler
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different year/class/house groups
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- Consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

4. Expectations for school uniform

4.1 Our School Uniform

Our school uniform is as follows:

- **Pale blue** - Blouse/shirt/polo shirt
- **Navy blue** - Jumper/sweatshirt/cardigan/fleece
- **Navy blue** - Skirt or pinafore dress (**Black from September 2027 onwards**)
- **Black** - Hijab/Patak
- **Black** - Trousers (boys & girls)
- **Black** - Shoes/ trainers (not logoed)
- **Black** - Jogging Pants (**Reception pupils only**)
- **Black** - Tights
- **Blue and white check** - Summer Dress
- **Navy and Grey** - School Ties

Black jogging bottoms are for **Reception pupils only** and are provided as an option where a child has a need for additional support with fastening clothing such as zips, buttons or belts. Where a child can manage these independently, they are expected to wear school trousers. Jogging bottoms are not intended as a general alternative to trousers, but as a support for individual needs during the Reception year.

From September onwards, the navy-blue skirt and pinafore dress will be phased out and replaced in line with the colour of the school trousers, which is black. This change is being made to ensure consistency across the school uniform and simplify expectations for families.

4.2 Shoes, Bags, Packed Lunch and Coats

We do not require children to wear school-branded shoes or coats, nor do we require school-branded packed lunch boxes.

Children are required to use the official school book bag to carry books and reading materials between home and school. Rucksacks and large backpacks are not permitted, as they take up unnecessary space in classrooms and cloakrooms. The school book bag is designed to keep books and learning materials neat, organised and in good condition.

4.3 PE and swimming kit

Children should wear their PE kit to school on the days they are scheduled to have a PE lesson. All PE kit items are generic and do not require school logos. The PE kit should consist of:

- White PE T-shirt
- Black PE shorts or black jogging bottoms
- Black plimsolls or trainers (without logos)

Children in the Foundation Stage are also encouraged to bring a waterproof rain mac for outdoor learning and garden activities during wet weather.

Swimming kit requirements will be shared with parents and carers before swimming lessons commence for the relevant year group. These requirements will be in line with the expectations and guidance provided by the swimming venue to ensure the safety, comfort and participation of all children.

Children in foundation stage are also encouraged to bring in a rain mac for garden activities in wet weather.

4.4 Jewellery and Make Up

Please ensure your child does not wear jewellery to school as this can be very dangerous and if lost can cause unnecessary distress to your child. No earrings, chains, rings or bracelets should be worn. If your child has pierced ears, they may wear small studs – please do not allow your child to wear big jewelled studs.

If a child wears inappropriate jewellery to school, they will be asked to remove it. This will be kept in the school office and parents will be asked to collect it at the end of the school day. The only exception to this is jewellery with religious significance. However, for health and safety reasons, any jewellery worn for religious significance must be small, discreet, and suitable for school. All jewellery **MUST** be removed for PE lessons. If a child cannot do this unaided, then it should not be worn to school. Children are not allowed to wear make up to school; this includes nail varnish.

Items of value should not be brought into school. The school cannot accept responsibility for the loss of any valuables or any items of school uniform.

4.5 Missing uniform

All clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name. This is especially important as uniform items look similar and can be easily confused for another children. Should your child lose any of their uniform we have a designated area for lost property in the corridor near the staffroom. Please check here for any items your child may be missing. At the end of term where possible, named clothing will be returned to your child's class. Any unclaimed/unnamed items are either sold/donated to parents by the school, or passed to a charity shop.

4.6 Where to purchase uniform

Clothing can be purchased from <https://khalaschoolwear.co.uk/> Khalsa Schoolwear, Dagenham

Store, Unit 1 Cromwell Centre, Selinas Lane, Dagenham RM8 1QH with free delivery to school office (during term time). Clothing in school colours but without the school logo can be bought more widely from supermarkets or high street retailers. Secondhand uniform is on offer during parent consultation meetings, where parents/carers can make a donation if they wish.

Parents/carers who are experiencing financial hardship can enquire at the school office where we may have second-hand uniform available at no cost.

5. Expectations for our school community

5.1 Pupils

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times (other than specified non-school uniform days) while:

- On the school premises
- Travelling to and from school
- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

Pupils are also expected to contact the Head of School if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.

5.2 Parents and carers

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name in good condition

Parents are also expected to contact the Head of School if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

Parents are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the school uniform in a timely and reasonable manner.

Disputes about the cost of the school uniform will be:

- Resolved locally
- Dealt with in accordance with our school's complaints policy

The school will work closely with parents to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome.

5.3 Staff

Staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in correct uniform. They will give any pupils and families breaching the uniform policy the opportunity to comply but will follow up with the Head of School if the situation doesn't improve.

Ongoing breaches of our uniform policy will be dealt with by the senior leadership team. This will involve a text or letter being sent to the parents, with future instances followed by a phone call or

meeting request.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation.

5.4 Governing Body

The Governing Body will review this policy and make sure that it:

- Is appropriate for our school's context
- Is implemented fairly across the school
- Takes into account the views of parents and pupils
- Offers a uniform that is appropriate, practical and safe for all pupils

The Governing Body will also make sure that the school's uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money, for example by avoiding single supplier contracts and by re-tendering contracts where necessary.

6. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed every four years by the governing body.
